Administrative Law: Advanced (JS 649)

This advanced-level, four-day course for experienced administrative law judges, adjudicators, and hearing officers gives an in-depth look at federal and state administrative law, including evidentiary trends in administrative proceedings, due process, ethics, and court procedures unique to administrative law, including the implications inherent in conducting telephone hearings. Special emphasis is placed on the impact of recent decisions. This course is being presented in-person and online.

During this course, you will learn to:

- 1. Apply due process and other constitutional developments affecting administrative adjudication;
- 2. Integrate recent evidentiary developments into your proceedings;
- 3. Re-evaluate pre-hearing and post-hearing procedures in your court;
- 4. Effectively examine your administrative hearings for implementation of ADR techniques;
- 5. Fortify your decisions to survive judicial review; and
- 6. Regulate the ethical behavior of counsel and presiding officers during administrative proceedings.
