

Decision Making is one of the NJC's bedrock courses, taken by generations of judges from across the country.

This course dives deep into the heart of judging: decision making. Experts review the neuroscience and psychology of decision making and assist each participant in finding and understanding their own decision making style. Sessions wade through ethical delimmas and the toughest decisions judges have to make. The course also tackles dealing with difficult litigants and the use of Al. There is a substantial emphasis on writing orders and opinions that will withstand substanial scrutiny in emotional and high-profile situations.

This course frequently utilizes break-out discussion groups where judges can examine and analyze course material as well as real-world examples from their courtrooms.

What is included in the fees?

Tuition includes all in-person materials and access to digital materials. The conference fee provides for all breakfasts and lunches.
