Special Court Jurisdiction: Advanced (JS 611)

- 3. Apply a practical approach to Fourth Amendment issues and use approved guidelines for issuing search warrants.
- 4. Conduct criminal hearings and trials in compliance with constitutional and statutory standards.
- 5. Make better decisions regarding the admissibility of evidence.
- 6. Work effectively with court interpreters.
- 7. Create an environment of fairness and impartiality in the courtroom.
