



Administrative Law: Fair Hearing (JS 612)

This intensive 8-day course provides newer state and federal administrative law adjudicators with a solid foundation in the tools and techniques to create and maintain a “fair hearing,” complete the record, and provide a clear order. Separate tracks are offered which recognize the differences between the conduct of low-volume and high-volume proceedings.

During this course, you will learn to:

- Utilize sound pre-hearing practice and case management techniques.
- Write decisions that will withstand judicial review.
- Effectively address the issue of caseload management.
- Incorporate alternative dispute resolution techniques where appropriate.
- Communicate effectively with litigants and colleagues.
- Create and maintain a bias-free environment.
- Evaluate witness and expert credibility.
- Appropriately apply the rules of evidence and procedure.
