This 3-1/2 day course is designed to provide appellate judges with advanced training in a variety of practical and often encountered issues. This course is designed to provide appellate judges with advanced topics in opinion writing, small group dynamics and collaborative decision-making, law clerk/staff management, how to get the most during oral argument, ethics as they pertain to appellate judges, and other topics of interest to the experienced appellate judge. In addition to structured, interactive presentations from faculty, participants will have several opportunities for peer-to-peer learning.

It is anticipated that the curriculum will include such topics as:

- 1. advanced opinion writing;
- 2. balancing with colleagues in collaborative decision-making versus writing separately;
- 3. pros and cons of oral argument;
- 4. factors in deciding whether or not to publish decisions;
- 5. civility and professionalism;
- 6. judicial ethics and judges' use of social media;
- judicial deference to agency decisions impact of recent developments;
